SOCIAL STUDIES

TODDLERS:
Seeks help from trusted parents, caregivers, and teachers

TWOS:
Talks about his or her family

EARLY PRESCHOOL:
Identify family members in relation to each other

PRESCHOOL:
Tells each family member's duties or responsibilities in the household

PRE-K:
Describes or illustrates the roles and responsibilities of community workers

NATURE & SCIENCE

TODDLERS:
Inspects and manipulates moving parts of a toy

TWOS:
Pokes, drops, pushes, pulls, and squeezes objects to see what will happen

EARLY PRESCHOOL:
Demonstrates some persistence and creativity in solving a problem

PRESCHOOL:
Participates in simple investigations

PRE-K:
Asks questions to help predict a future event

LITERACY

TODDLERS:
Makes purposeful marks on paper

TWOS:
Draws horizontal and vertical lines

EARLY PRESCHOOL:
Draws figures and shapes

PRESCHOOL:
Communicates by scribbling and with some letter-like shapes

PRE-K:
Writes his or her name without assistance

MATH

TODDLERS:
Predicts the sequence of events

TWOS:
Asks questions that include how many or how much

EARLY PRESCHOOL:
Identifies some numbers

PRESCHOOL:
Counts to find out how many are in a group

PRE-K:
Writes numerals up to 20

CREATIVE ARTS EXPRESSION

TODDLERS:
Participates in various art activities

TWOS:
Gets out art supplies independently

EARLY PRESCHOOL:
Uses various tools to create art projects

PRESCHOOL:
Creates collages with various materials and textures

PRE-K:
Draws representations of human and animal figures
